Term 2 Curriculum

Reading

During Reading this term, Year 5 teachers are extending and supporting our students reading comprehension and enhancing their ability to make text connections, specifically to our Inquiry unit. Teachers have also encouraged students to read a variety of genres at home, that can be described as a 'Take A Break Book', a text that is easy for students to decode and understand or a 'Just Right Book' where students can decode the text, while increasing their vocabulary, and challenge their thinking, with less predictable story lines and content. We thank all parents for supporting our home reading program through providing a regular routine for children to read, listening to their children read aloud and engaging in discussions with your children about the texts and genres they are reading. Our Year 5 pod libraries have many titles that are suitable for home reading, please contact your child's teacher if you need support to engage your child in home reading.

Maths

Term 3 has begun with a valuable immersion program into our times tables. We have been identifying areas to improve and participating in hands-on games and activities to strengthen and quicken these skills. The Year 5 students have highly enjoyed this work and see the benefits of improving these skills. Common times tables that need extra practise are the 6's, 7's and 8's, so reinforcement of these at home would be highly beneficial. Next we will be moving onto our fractions, decimals and percentages unit, beginning with an immersion day and pre-test of prior skills. Keep an eye out for the new learning goals for these around week 3. A great way to help with this unit will be to identify and utilise fractions (eg cooking measures), decimals (eg money) and percentages (eg shopping discounts) in your daily lives.

Inquiry

This Term the Year 5 students will be completing a new unit, *Are We There Yet?* This unit covers Australia's history from 1800 to 1900 and Immigration Periods including Convicts, The Gold Rush, Assisted Migration, Displaced Persons, Refugees and Asian and Middle Eastern Migration. We were extremely lucky to have been able to visit the Immigration Museum in Melbourne to gather inspiration and immerse ourselves in the topic. Students have selected an Immigration Period that they would like to become an expert in. From here they will be developing a 'suitcase presentation' and take on the role of a character from that time.

Your child will require a suitcase for their presentation later in the term. We encourage students to be creative and reuse or recycle items like old cardboard boxes that could be covered with wrapping paper or painted. Your child might like to try and create a suitcase that matches the time period their character represents.
